Subject: Voluntary Watering Restrictions – Drought Contingency Plan

Williamson County MUD #10 residents:

Recently, the City of Round Rock notified the District that it has lifted Stage 1 of its drought contingency plan effective 4/29/15. Stage 1 included mandatory watering restrictions. This is as the result of the water levels of Lake Georgetown and Stillhouse Hollow Lake recovering to 100% capacity following rainfall in the Central Texas area. In accordance with its contract with the City of Round Rock and the District's Water Conservation and Drought Contingency Plan, the District has lifted Stage 1 of its drought contingency plan **effective May 1, 2015. The District is now in voluntary restrictions.**

Residents are asked to follow the provisions of the Stage 1 Watering Restrictions on a voluntary basis.

Twice-Per-Week Watering Restriction Schedule as follows:

1. Single Family Odd Addresses: **Wednesday & Saturday**
2. Single Family Even Addresses: **Thursday & Sunday**
3. All other type (HOA irrigation, etc.) customers: **Tuesday & Friday**
