Notice: Stage 2 Water Use Restrictions In Effect

Remaining Consistent with the District's Drought Contingency Plan, which is required by State law, the District implemented <u>Stage 2</u> mandatory watering restrictions effective October 1, 2023 in an effort to manage the community water supply, and ability to provide firefighting water supplies. The goal for Stage 2 is to achieve a 10% reduction in average daily water use.

Customers may not irrigate doors except:

with a hand-held hose or a hand-held bucket at any time;

With a hand-held hose or a hand held bucket at any time.

- i. with a soaker hose for vegetable gardens;
- ii. with a hose-end sprinkler, a soaker hose, or drip irrigation, from 12:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. and from 7:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m. on a Designated Outdoor Water Use Day; or
- iii. with a permanently installed automatic irrigation system from 12:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. on a Designated Outdoor Water Use Day.
